

# Tennis Selection Policy for 32<sup>nd</sup> SEA Games, Phnom Penh, Cambodia: 5 to 17 May 2023



## 1. Criteria for nomination to Long List for SNOC's consideration

- i. Singapore Citizens only and should not be holding dual citizenship if above 21 years old, at the time of nomination. (SEA Games rule)
- ii. Current National Squad Members/ Youth Squad Members
- iii. SEA Games Squad in the past three years
- iv. Past two Davis Cup/Billie Jean King Cup Squads
- v. Men and Women ranked in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division 1 Singles Ranking list
- vi. Recommendations by Selection & Preparation Panel

## 2. Securing SNOC's Nomination for SEA Games

- i. Showcase playing record in the past 12 months is able to meet SNOC qualifying mark for SEA Games (i.e., 3rd placing in Southeast Asia)
- ii. All achievements should be achieved from 1 April 2022 up to the Entry by Name deadline, which is likely to be in March 2023 (subject to local organizing committee's confirmation).
- iii. To enable benchmarking, playing record should:
  - *Showcase player can beat players from the top 3 SEA countries based on Davis Cup/Billie Jean King Cup Squad rankings*
  - *Showcase player can beat last SEA Games medallist's 3rd in Southeast Asia in term of Individual Ranking (ATP, WTA) and Team Ranking (Davis Cup and Billie Jean King ranking)*
- iv. If the number of players qualified by SNOC exceeds the maximum number required for SEA Games, a selection trial will be conducted to select the number of required players
- v. Points (i), (ii) and (iii) must be submitted by a date as designated by SNOC.

## 3. Other Considerations

In addition to the above selection criteria, the following “qualities” of the athletes will be taken into consideration:

- i. Attitude and behaviour towards coaches, teammates, fellow athletes, officials and sports administrators, whether in relation to sporting matters or otherwise.
- ii. General conduct and character which may affect the reputation, image, values or best interests of the athlete or the sport.
- iii. Past disciplinary record.
- iv. Current skill level and fitness; and character
- v. Level of commitment and attendance
- vi. Potential for future development
- vii. Ability to demonstrate team spirit and work well with team mates

## 4. Extenuating Circumstances

In consideration of the performance and “qualities” of athletes, the selectors may at their discretion give consideration to extenuating circumstances. For this purpose, “extenuating circumstances” mean an inability of the athlete to compete in and/or attend event, training camps or other required attendances arising from:

- Injury or illness
- Equipment failure
- Travel delays
- Bereavement
- Such other circumstances as the selectors may consider to be relevant

## 5. Appeal Process

Any athlete/player who was not selected by the SNOC Selection Committee may write in to appeal.

For appeals to be considered by the SNOC Appeals Committee, the athlete/player must write in officially to the Singapore Tennis Association (STA).
